1) SUICIDE:

This I believe is just as much a federal issue as state and in saying that, I would expect the Prime Minister and his cabinet to give it some level of priority and action. Mr. Beasley spoke about suicide; he said that Mr Howard should make it his number one priority for Parliament 99. On a state level, Mr Carr and Dr Rafshorgi's efforts resided over an increase in the suicide rate. Kim gave a very heart wrenching speech, which emphasised the problem in dealing with suicide (as being an individual tragedy) and because of this, he reasons, that it's impossible to do anything to stop. Therefore legislation, services and funding must all be in place and maintained. So that not only can those people or their concerned party phone to be assisted, the assistance has to be able to actually help and reassure the individual, via the means of, either immediate person to person contact, A Doctors referral or attendance, hospitalisation, counselling, therapy, or medication. Further more this assistance must be functional, being capable of providing the above service, but also have the authority (degree subject to circumstance) to intervene, fast track or mediate in matters of immediate concern to that individual. Only then will any real impact be seen as a true reduction.

Undoubtedly it will become another long running issue (as it is) just let continue. Only ever making announcements when the media giants break a story. It's just like all the other long running issues, whose priorities are so important they warrant becoming a political tool. 2) MEDICAL SERVICES; HEALTH:

Constant cost cutting has seen disposable equipment allegedly re-used; excessively overworked staff in an understaffed environment making decisions lives depends on. Right across the state of NSW our health system is kept afloat only by dialysis. In fact, the general archaic state of our health system is greatly responsible for the level of infection and death by 'misadventure' in our hospitals. This is due to the funding shortage of rudimentary and intensive health services, forced management decisions detrimental to the adequate delivery of a competent and fully provisioned health service. 3) INDUSTRY (RURAL and PLANT)

RURAL: The Rural sector has born the brunt of the past three decades of insane political policy. It is another major victim of our road to ruination being paved with foreign interests, Fabian philosophy, greed and stupidity. The problem inherently is people in power making decisions over matters of which they have no sound knowledge and base their decisions upon poor, inaccurate and misleading information, however ultimately it is made by the majority who hold vested interests detrimental to those whom they are suppose to serve. Care for the environment has also suffered greatly through policies designed to prevent what they have in fact caused. On top of this they also greatly hinder sound farming practices and economy.

80 % of Australian grown produce is now purchased by the supermarket cartels, which lock farmers into contracts of which gives them full control and creates an environment of dictatorial terms on which the farmer has little choice. They also engage in the illegal practice of black banning Farmers, who realise only too late exactly what has been done to them, (and the supermarkets complain about unions).

“Savings to the consumer”. While farmers find themselves often receiving less for their produce from the supermarkets, the actual price on the shelf seldom decreases and usually increases from already being many times the cost of the initial produce to the supermarket. E.g. Milk, Potatoes, etc.

The rural sector is in desperate need of tariffs and subsidies, and it is vitally important that the Sector be re-regulated as soon as possible.

Only a relatively small percentage of Australian land is suitable for farming, and only the devoted are suitable for farming it. While our farmers disappear and greed and vested interests carve up fertile land, the monopolies of multinational companies continue to expand.

Australia is no longer able to sustain itself; Farming is a long-term endeavour, which can take around a decade or even much longer to make fully operational and viable. The time to remedy this dilemma has to be now! Otherwise the day of reckoning will come where food in Australia is scarce and people will starve. Sounds laughable right? See if you're still laughing when it happens. Australians in ever-larger numbers are already growing hungry.

Plant: Drastic measures are also required for manufacturers in all areas of small and medium businesses. Business has also been decimated over the past three decades from absurd government policies. Policies supposedly designed to make industry more competitive and safer. All it has really achieved is to force businesses to subtly cut corners to appear to abide by government regulation; many however went bust, or struggle to even be viable.
